Latino Decisions

Methodology

- National and State Survey
 - National N=1,854 eligible Latino voters
 - Texas N=304
- Field Dates: June 1-14, 2019
- English or Spanish, according to preference
- Blended sample, online and live telephone interviews
- State sample margin of error of + / 5.5 percentage points

Important Candidate Qualities Texas Latino Voters

Which of the following traits do you think are important in a presidential candidate?



Percent responding trait is "very important" in a presidential candidate

	Values diversity and brings people together	79%
	Has realistic, achievable policy ideas and goals	74%
	Fights for my priorities, willing to work with both parties, compromise to get things done	72%
	Has specific plans addressing the issues Latino voters say are important to them	60%
	Has prior experience in elected office	56%
	Has bold and ambitious policy ideas, even if they are hard to achieve quickly	53%
	Fights for my priorities and will not compromise, even if it means nothing gets done	52%
	Has business or private sector work experience	37%
	Speaks Spanish	32%


Which trait do you think is the MOST important in a presidential candidate

Factors Driving Priority Issues

What is it about [issue ranked first among issue priorities] that concerns you?

- Among those who ranked jobs and economy first priority
 - Unemployment, not enough jobs, job insecurity
- Among those who ranked health care first priority
 - Too expensive, unaffordable
- Among those who ranked immigration first
 - Stop separating families, abuses/children in cages

Factors Driving Priorities on Candidate Quality and Issues (Texas)

I am frustrated with how President Trump and his allies treat immigrants and Latinos, worry it will get worse if Trump is re-elected.

I am concerned that Social Security will not be around when I retire, or that my current benefits could be cut.

I worry that I, or my children will not be able to afford college, or pay off student loans.

It seems like politicians in Washington DC ignore people like me, they take Latino voters for granted.


I am concerned that I may not be able to afford to own a home, or afford to keep the one I have now.

Immigration Policy Priority (Texas)


Which immigration issue do you want a new President to address first?

Pass laws that protect undocumented immigrants who were brought to the United States as children and grew up here, such as "Dreamers" or DACA recipients.


Building a 1,900-mile wall between the entire border between the United States and Mexico.


Baseline Republican Support (Texas)



Republican Support Among TX Latinos Who Have Not Voted Republican


[Among those who have never voted Republican in past elections.]

Would you consider voting for a Republican candidate who spoke out against President Trump's harsh policies, treated Latinos with respect, and worked to create more humane immigration laws?




Republican Support Among TX Latinos Who Have Not Voted Republican




Republican Support Among TX Latinos Who Have Voted GOP in Prior Elections






Republican Support Among TX Latinos Who Have Voted GOP in Prior Elections

Have you ever voted for a Republican candidate in past elections?





Thinking ahead to the 2020 Democratic Party primaries and caucuses, what are the chances you will participate and vote to choose which Democratic candidate will run against President Trump?








If the 2020 presidential election were held today, would you vote for...

Key Findings

- Ideal candidate will unify the country, has realistic policy goals, and will get them done.
- Ideal candidate will address issues that resonate at personal level for this electorate: wages, health care costs, and immigration.
- Republicans leaving votes on the table
 - Only 17% like today's GOP
 - > 56% of prior GOP voters in TX have hard time supporting the party today.
- TBD Democrat leads Trump 62:20
 - But 18% of Texas eligible voters are undecided
